DIAGNOSIS AND TREATMENT PLANNING



This course presents a systematic method for assessing problems, assigning risks and prognostic differentiation to complex restorative cases. A novel technique for organizing and sequencing treatment will be described which may be implemented immediately in your practice. Smile design and esthetic analysis is an integral part of this course.



RESTORATIVE **UPDATE**



This course provides the general dentist with an overview of hot topics and key restorative insights in a broad range of topics, from caries removal, liners and bases, build-ups, impressions, provisionals, cements and ceramic materials.



CERAMIC RESTORATIONS



This course gives a detailed review of all of the ceramic techniques and systems available to the restorative dentist, including preparation design, veneers, inlays, onlays, all-ceramic crowns, CAD/CAM restorations, cementation and occlusal adjustment.



CAST GOLD RESTORATIONS



This course gives a detailed review of conservative cast gold techniques and for the restorative dentist, including preparation design, inlays, onlays, partial coverage crowns, impression techniques, provisional, laboratory key factors, cementation, finishing and polishing and occlusal adjustment.

EDUCATION

FOR DENTISTS & TECHNICIANS



COMPOSITE RESTORATIONS



This course gives a detailed review of conservative direct composite techniques and for the restorative dentist, including preparation design, matrix options, layering techniques, tinting and staining, finishing and polishing and occlusal adjustment.



FUNCTIONAL OCCLUSION



This course gives a brief history of occlusion theory, but focuses on a detailed practical and easy to implement approach to occlusion for the restorative dentist. Topics will include making a functional diagnosis, using deprogrammers and leaf gauges, equilibration, accurate centric relation records, and when to restore vertical dimension of occlusion.



IMPLANT RESTORATIONS



This course gives a detailed review of implant techniques and for the restorative dentist, including implant selection, abutment design, cement vs. screw retained implants, fixed implant supported partial dentures, esthetic provisionals and occlusal management.


